



In pursuance of the Several Acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations or other office titles issued from or under the proprietary government And by the Authority of the Board of Property I have this 16th day of February 1828 Surveyed the above described tract of Three hundred & thirteen acres and allowance of Six per Cent. in the forks of Blacklick Creek about a mile above the forks adjoining land Surveyed to Thomas McArthur & John Chain, Peter Wallace Samuel Dickson & others Situate in Blacklick Township in the County of Indiana By virtue of a Location of the 3^d April 1769 granted to James Miller - No 3100.

N.B. So much of the above Survey as is represented by the dotted lines and the letters A B
was Surveyed to Peter Wallace on the 31st of March 1787 By warrant of the 17th Augt 1784
and that part including the letters C, D & E was Surveyed to Samuel Porter in trust
for the heirs of John McCrea Deed on the 13th day of May 1790 - By warrant of the
18 June 1787 - And that including the letter F was Surveyed to James Mitchell
the 19th Novr 1814. By warrant of the 26th Octr 1814.
