Whereas Nicholas Skull being Desireous to Purchase a Tract of Land in ye Mannor of Springfield adjoining on ye Land he now holds in ye sd Mannor and Running from ye Southwest Corner thereof by Thomas Fitzwaters Line to Daniell Howels northeast Corner Containing by Estimation Two hundred acres or thereabouts for w^{ch} he hath agreed to pay for ye use of ye Proprietary Forty Pounds for Every hundred acres & so proportionally one Moiety of the whole at or before ye 29th day of g^{ber} next wth Lawfull Interest for ye same to ~~ye~~ ye sd time & ye other Moiety at or before ye 25th day of ye 1st mo^o Next Ensuing These therefore are to Require thee forthwith to survey & Lay out to ye sd Nicholas Skull ye sd Tract of Land Situate as aforesd & make Returns thereof into ye Gen^l Surveyors Office at Philadelphia where this warrant is to Remain & a Copy thereof to be Delivered to thee Certified by ye Secretary being so made & Returned Shall in Case ye sd Nicholas fulfill ye agreement aforesd be Valid other wise Shall be void & of no other Effect Than as if ye same had never been made nor this Warrant Ever Granted Given under our hands & ye seal of ye Province at Philadelphia ye 28th of ye 2^d mo^o 1702
