



The tract No. 1 was surveyed and returned for John Baird Esqr in Pt. of John Smodie.

No. 2 was originally surveyed on a right of Doctor Morgan and was held by that right until this last winter when a new survey was made on a warrant which is likely in the office by this time all the other land about was long since warranted and patented and the application though made for the above land was never legally claimed since the war - I would observe also that there were three applications made all reading the same way yet nevertheless not intended for the same ground may be accounted for - thus then being so many Sewickley's that the word little was deemed a sufficient distinction from the rest and the old Indian path to Yough Creek or River went nearly parallel to ~~the~~ the little Sewickley and within a mile or so all along
