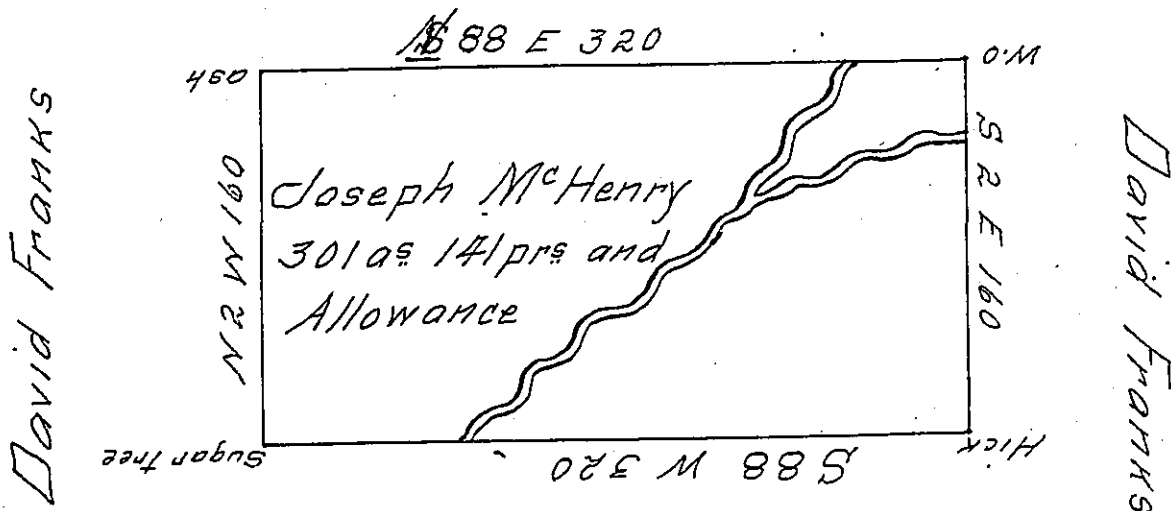

Situate in a bend of Youghiogheny River on a hill known by the name of an Indian old town and on Sewickly creek in South Huntington township in the County of Westmoreland
