



The Draught of a Tract of Land situate on the west side of Susquehanna River at the mouth of Berry's Creek in Cumberland County, Pa. surveyed the 15th of November A. Dom: 1774 and found to contain twenty seven acres and allow: For John Pfoutz, in consequence of directions from the Secretary's office; the original warrant under which the survey was made having issued to Thomas Kiston on 28th of July, 1789, under which John Pfoutz claims as Assignee.

Note: the orders from the Secretary's Office, seem to want precision, a resurvey is first mentioned, the officer is again restricted to the proper quantity (Viz 25a) and lastly enjoined to take in Pfoutz's Surveys and transmit it ⁱⁿ to the office.

The above is a Resurvey and agreeable to the old lines.
