At the Request of George Claypoole That we would Grant him to take up five hundred Acres of Land in Right of a Purchase of One Thousand Acres made of the Proprietor by his father James Claypoole by Deeds dated the 29<sup>th</sup> & 30<sup>th</sup> Days of April 1683 Whereof Nine hundred and Twenty Acres are now Granted by the Executrix & other heirs of the Said James to the sd George by Deeds of Lease & Release dated the 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup> of this Instant: These are to Authorize thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd to the said George Claypoole according to the Method of Townships appointed the Said quantity of five hundred Acres of Land in this Province that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>la</sup> the 13<sup>th</sup> of the 3<sup>d</sup> Month 1713
