At y<sup>e</sup> Request of Arthur Cook in right of Francis Burrough Purchaser of One Thousand Acres of Land, y<sup>e</sup> we would grant him to take up his Lotts in y<sup>e</sup> City & Land in y<sup>e</sup> Liberties proportionable: These are in y<sup>e</sup> Proprietary's Name to will & require Three forth w<sup>th</sup> to Survey or cause to be surveyed unto him y<sup>e</sup> sd Lotts w<sup>th</sup> ere they fell & Lands proportionable w<sup>th</sup> in y<sup>e</sup> Bounds of y<sup>e</sup> Liberties, he building upon y<sup>e</sup> front Lott w<sup>th</sup> in Six Months from y<sup>e</sup> Date of Survey, & fencing & clearing y<sup>e</sup> Lott in High Street, & make Returns thereof into y<sup>e</sup> Secretarys Office. Given at Philadelphia y<sup>e</sup> 23<sup>d</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> 11<sup>th</sup> m<sup>o</sup> 1684.
