At the Request of Benjamin Chambers That we would grant him to take up the Lotts in the High Street of the City Philad^{ia} appurtenant to the Original Purchase of One thousand acres of Land made by himself, and of fifteen hundred acres made by James Kennesly & Henry Maddock. the right to ~~which~~ ^{the} Lotts, ^{of w^{ch} sd Purchas} the sd Benjamin hath also Bought. These are to Authorize and Require thee to survey and lay out to the sd Benjamin Chambers on the North side of the High Street between the 7th and 8th Streets from the River Delaware, and next adjoining to the Lott laid out to Edw^d Jefferson or his widow Mercy Philips being the true place where Henry Maddock's High street Lott originally fell. One Lott of Land of forty foot in breadth in right of the sd Maddock & Kennesly, and One other Lott adjoining of twenty six foot in breadth in right of the sd Benjamins Purchase, and make Returns of both the sd Lotts in one into the Secretaries Office. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 21st day of the 6th Month 1706.
