

By vertue of a warrant from Edward Pennington Surveyor  
 General bearing date the 8<sup>th</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> 8<sup>th</sup> m<sup>o</sup> 1700 directed unto  
 me I do hereby Certify into his Office that I have Surveyed and  
 Laid out to James Craven the 4<sup>th</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> 9<sup>th</sup> m<sup>o</sup> Ensueing a  
 Certaine tract of Land in a Township Called Limbrick in the  
 County of Philadelphia begining at a post in a street or  
 Roade of Sixty foot broad. Runing through the Said Town-  
 ship being a Corner post deviding it from Thomas Philips Land  
 from thence by the said Philips Line of marked trees North  
 East five hundred perches to a post Sett up in the  
 ground from thence North west by a Line of marked  
 trees one hundred and Sixty perches to another post  
 Sett in the ground from thence South west by a Line of  
 marked trees five hundred ~~two~~ perches to a post Sett in  
 the ground in the Said Street or Roade from thence by  
 the Same South East one hundred and Sixty perches  
 to the place of begining Containeing and Laid out for  
 five hundred acres of Land
