 Secretarys Office. Dated at Philadelphia the 26<sup>th</sup>  
 day of the 2<sup>d</sup> Month 1689 being the fifth year of the  
 Kings Reign & Ninth of the Proprietarys Govern<sup>mt</sup>:
