Whereas in pursuance of a late Act of Assembly of this Province for Confirming unto Benjamin Chambers his Ex^{ts} Adm^{rs} & Assigns the Lower ferry upon Skuykill for the Space of One & twenty years. We have in the Proprietors name & behalf Granted him a Patent of Confirmation for the Same: And in the said Patent for the better accommodation of the Said ferry in transporting Drovers of Cattle towards Philad^{ia} We have ^{for the term aforesaid} Granted to the said Benjamin One Acre and a half of that vacant Marsh or Swampy Land lying on the East Side of the said ferry and adjacent to the Road to be laid out on either Side of y^e Said Road in such manner as might best accommodate the ferry as aforesaid: Now at y^e Request of the Said Benjamin Chambers That we would Order & Direct the said Ground to be actually Survey'd These are to authorize and Require thee to Survey and lay out the Said One ^{of y^e vacant} acre and a half of vacant Marsh with so much ^{fast} Land adjoining to the same as may be sufficient for a Landing in such a form & Manner as may best accommodate the Said ferry for the purpose aforesaid Provided that it shall not extend in breadth at right angles from y^e Road on either Side above
