the forthwith to survey or cause to be survey'd to her  
the Said Lott, (She fencing it within three Months and  
building upon it within three Years after it is actually  
Survey'd) and make Returns thereof into my Secretaries  
Office. Given under my Hand and Seal at Philadel-  
phia the 4<sup>th</sup> day of y<sup>e</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1700.
