William Penn Absolute Proprietary and Govern^r in Chief
of the Province of Pensilvania and Counties Annexed
At the Request of Christopher Pennock Attorney for James
Craven, That I would grant him to take up five Hundred Acres
of Land in right of his Said Constituent old Purchaser of one
Thousand Acres, These are to require thee forthwith
to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto him the Said Num-
ber of Acres of Land not already taken up, nor con-
cealed nor cleared by the Indians to be laid out ac-
cording to the Method of Townships by me appointed,
He taking out a Patent for the Same within three Months
after thou shalt make Returns thereof. ~~unto~~ to my Sec-
retaries Office, w^{ch} thou art hereby required to doe with
all Convenient Speed. Given under my Hand and Seal
at Pensbury this 2^d day of the 7th Month 1700.
