 Certifie Into his Secretarys office y<sup>t</sup> I have Caused to be Sur-  
 veyd and Set out unto John <sup>R</sup>Culcupp y<sup>e</sup> 29<sup>th</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> Said  
 moneth his Lott in y<sup>e</sup> City of Philadelphia Containing in  
 breadth forty foot and In Length three hundred and Six foot  
 bounded northward w<sup>th</sup> back Lotts Southwards w<sup>th</sup> ~~Say~~  
 Mulberry Street formerly Called Holme Street, Eastward  
 w<sup>th</sup> a Vacant Lott, Westward w<sup>th</sup> y<sup>e</sup> 3<sup>rd</sup> Street from Skool-  
 Kill and is Accordingly Entred and Recorded in my office  
 Philadelphia this 10<sup>th</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> mo 168<sup>obl</sup>.
