

By vertue of an order from y^e Commissioners I do hereby Certifie that there was Resurveyed a quantity of Land Lying on the west side of Schuylkil in the township of blockly belonging to Benjamin Chambers, Begining att a Marked white oke standing att y^e East-ermost Corner of Thomas Pascals Land, thence North west by y^e sd Pascals Land fifty three perches to a spanish oke marked for a Corner, thence west by the same Land, one hundred twenty three perches to a Spanish oke marked for a Corner, thence North by the same Land one hundrd forty Eight perches to a marked white oke standing att the corner of the Land belonging to y^e widdow James, thence East by y^e said widdows Land by a Line of marked trees two hundred twenty four perches to a post standing in ^{a Corner} ~~the~~ of the said widdow's Land thence south by the said widdow's Land & by the Land of William Brown, by a Line of Marked trees ~~two hundred twenty four perches~~ fifty three perches to a small oke saplin, thence East by the said Browns Land by a Line of marked trees Eighty seven perches & a half to a marked smale tickery saplin, thence north by the said Browns Land forty one perches & a half to a Marked black oke, standing att the westernmost Corner of the Land belonging to Samuel Bradshaw, thence south seventy two degrees East by y^e sd Bradshaw's Land twenty three perches to a tickery stumpe standing att y^e Corner of John Gardeners Land, thence south by y^e said Gardeners Land one hundred & Eighteen perches to a small white oke saplin thence East by the said Gardeners Land twenty seven perches to a marked black oke, thence south seventy two degrees East by the said Gardeners Land, one hundred sixty five perches to a post standing by bever runn, thence down the severall courses of y^e sd bever runn, thirty
