



At y^e Request of Berj Chambers in y^e behalfe of himselfe and those hereafter mentioned that wee would grant them to take up their respective quantities of Land as near as Conveniently (where not taken up) to y^e Line he intends to runn ffrom Philadelphia to Susquehanna River viz. to Berj Chambers three hundred seventy ffour acres, to James Hunt nine hundred and Eighty acres, to Henry Green four hundred ninty two acres, to Peter Bland four hundred and ninty acres, makeing hereby voyde y^e warr^{ts} that was fformerly granted them to take up their Land in y^e County of Philadelphia.

These are therefore in y^e Proprietarys name to will and require thee fforthwith to survey or Cause to be surveyed y^e Severall tracts aforementioned, in manner aforesaid, they Seating and Improveing y^e same within six months after y^e Date of survey and make returne thereoff to y^e Secretarys Office, Dated at Philad y^e 1st day of y^e 4th Month 1688.
