



Pursuant to a warrant from the proprietors Commissioners of property bearing date the 11th day of the 3^d mo. 1702 directed unto me I do hereby Certify that I have Surveyed the 23^d of the 6th mo. next Ensueing unto William Cuarton a Certaine peec of Land Within the Liberty of the City of Philadelphia begining at a stake in a Line of William Smiths Land from thence by a Line of Marked trees North 56 perches to a stake set in the ground being a Corner deviding it from John Bals Land from thence west by a Line of Marked trees 21 p^{er}ches to another Stake by a Whit oak marked from thence South by a Line of Marked trees 66 perches to another stake by a whit oak marked from thence East North East 23 perches by John Marshalls Land to place of begining Containeing 8 acres of Land and is According to the bounds above described Returned into the Generall Surveyors office at Philadelphia the 9th day of the 9th mo. 1702/
