At the Request of Samuel Carpenter Anthony Morris and others in behalf of the Meeting of friends that we would grant them to take up the front and high Street Lotts appurtenant to the Original Purchase of twelve hundred and fifty Acres of Land Made by George Fox together with his proportionable part of Liberty Land belonging thereunto w^{ch} Lotts and Liberty Land were said to be bequeathed by the sd. George to the Meeting of fr^{ds} in the Town of Philad^{ia}. These are to Authorize and Require thee forthwith to Survey to the ~~the~~ said, Samuel Carpenter Anthony Morris and others upon the right and for the use aforesd One Lott in the high street of thirty three foot where Vacant, and that Lott in the ^{front} ~~high~~ Street w^{ch} was formerly granted to Anthony Tomkins and Surrendered to the Prop^r by legal Deeds by his Assignee Griffith Jones. Also, ^{with these} to make Returns of the twenty acres Liberty Land laid out to the sd fr^{ds} by Tho. ffairman into the General Surveyors Office at Philad^{ia} where this Warr^t is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delvd to thee certified by the Secretary.
