



By Vertue of a war^t from Edward Penington Survey^r Generall bareing dat the _____ directed unto me, I hereby Certiety into his office that I have Survaid and Laid out unto Daniell ffalkner agent for the German or ffrankford Companie a Certaine tract of Land within the bounds of the Libarty of philladelphia beginning at a Corner Stak Sett in the Line of Benjamin Morgans Land from thene by the Said Land and the Land belonging to Wisahickans Mill West South West 244 perches to the Scoolkeel x River from thene by the Severall Courses of the Same 124 1/2 perches to a post Sett in the ground from thene by Vaccant Land East North East by a Line of marke^d trees 138 perches to a Corner post from theneby vaccant Land North North West by a Line of Marked trees 88 perches to the place of beginning Containing & Laid out for one hundred acres of Land the 14th of the 9th mo: 1701:
