Whereas a certain Tract of Land Scituate in the Falls Township in the County of Bucks was laid out in the Year 1682 by Virtue of my order to Randall Blackshaw for Five hundred Acres in right of James Harrison first Purchaser of Five thousand Acres, which said Tract (excepting a part thereof reputed to contain about one hundred Acres) was since conveyed by the said Randal Blackshaw to Joseph Kirkbride, upon which remaining four hundred Acres so reputed the said Joseph Kirkbride hath requested me to grant him a resurvey.

These are therefore to will and require thee forthwith to resurvey or cause to be resurveyed unto the said Joseph Kirkbride the said tract according to the first bounds, lines of Survey & Subdivision and make returns Thereof into my Secretarys Office - Given under my hand and Seal at Philadelphia the 24th day of ye 8th month 1701.
