William Penn Absolute Proprietary & Governo^r in Chief of the Province of Pensilvania and Counties annexed.

At the request of William Pennington by thee his Attorney that I would grant him to take up Twelve hundred and fifty acres of Land in this Province in right of the said quantity by me formerly granted him with the first Purchasers, I do hereby will and require thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyed unto the said William Pennington the said Twelve hundred ~~and~~ and fifty Acres in two Tracts at least, of Land within this Province not already taken up and make returns thereof into my Secretaries Office, Given under my hand and Seal at Philadelphia the 25th day of the 8th month 1701.
