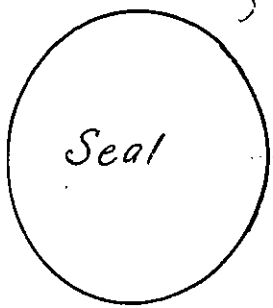

*Whereas There was a Certain Tract of Land Situate in Newtown in  
the County of Bucks Surveyd and laid out to Jonathan Eldridge  
for Two hundred and fifty Acres. These are to require thee forthwith  
to Resurvey or cause to be Resurveyd the Said Tract according  
to the first Bounds and Lines of Survey and make exact  
Returns thereof into my Secretaries office Given under my hand and  
Seal at Philadelphia the fourth day of the first Month 1700*
