



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietary's Comm<sup>r</sup>s to me directed bearing date the 6<sup>th</sup> day of the 2<sup>d</sup> month 1702 Resurveyed unto John Eastborne a Tract of Land in Southampton Township in the County of Bucks, beginning at a Post by the Street at Widow Cutler's Corner, Thence by the Said Street N.W. 262 perches to a Post, Then N.E. by John Naylor's overplus land 322 perches to a Post, Then S.E. by the same 100 perches to a Post, Then by the said Naylor's old Tract S 43  $\frac{3}{4}$  deg<sup>r</sup>s. W. 222 perches to a Post. Then by the same S.E. 157 perches to a Post in Widow Cutler's line, Then by the said line S.W. 100 perches to the place of beginning Containing 305  $\frac{3}{4}$  Acres. Resurveyed the 6<sup>th</sup> day of the 6<sup>th</sup> month 1702.
