William Penn Absolute Proprietary and Govern^r in Chief

At the Request of Nathaniel Puckle I would grant him to
take up three hundred Acres of Land part of twelve hundred and
fifty Acres by him purchased of James Brooks (together wth another
parcel of 150 Acres) who purchased the 5^d 1250 Acres of W^m Wade
Original Purchaser of the Same. These are to require three forthth to
Survey or Cause to be Survey'd unto the 5^d Nathaniel Puckle according
to the Method of Townships by me appointed, the 5^d number of three
hundred Acres of Land not already Survey'd nor taken up nor
conceal'd nor Seated by the Indians, And make Returns —
thereof into my Secretaries Office.
