

Pensilvania S.S. By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of David Powell of the City of Philadelphia that we would Grant him to take up the City Lots belonging to the Original purchase of one Thousand Acres of Land made of the late Proprietor by George Pownall since Deceased whose Surviving Sons Ruben and George Pownall by Indenture dated the 19th day of February anno 1712 Granted & Conveyd the said City Lots unto the said David Powell who requests that in Consideration of his disappointments in relation to some purchases he has formerly made that we would permit the said Lots to be Surveyd together about the Sixth or Seventh Streets from Delaware, These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey and lay out or cause to be Surveyd and laid out unto the Said David Powell on or about the place by him requested (if there to be found vacant) the said Lots of Ground, to be in front forty nine ^{& a half each lot} foot and in length the same with the adjoining Lots and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office, Given under our hands and the lesser Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 25th day of the Eleventh Month AD. 1726
