

By virtue of a Warrant of from the Commissioners of Property dated the tenth Day of the Seventh Month 1717 for Laying out to David Powel of Philadelphia three thousand acres of Land There was Surveyed and Laid out in Part of the Same one Tract in the County of Philadelphia Containing four hundred acres Sold by the said David to John Henrick Hagiman Henry ffrey and Albertus Inglehort in Such Parts and Parcels as follows

To John Henrick Hagiman two hundred acres Beginning at an Ashen Tree at a Corner of Darby Green's Land and Running by the Same South East two hundred perches to a Post Then ^{by} Henry ffrey's Land North East One hundred and Sixty pches to a post. Then North West two hundred pches. Then by John Henry Sprægles line South West One hundred and Sixty perches to the place of Beginning Containing two hundred Acres.

To Henry ffrey One hundred Acres Beginning at a Corner of John Henrick Hagiman's Land & Running by Joseph Pyke's land South East fifty pches to a post Then by Albertus Inglehort's line North East One hundred and Seven perches to a post. Then South East by the said Inglehort's land One hundred and ffifty pches to a Post. Then North East ffifty three perches to a post. Then North West two hundred pchs to a post, Then by the said John Henrick Hagiman's Land South West one hundred and Sixty pches to the place of Beginning Containing 200^a as aforesaid

To Albertus Inglehort One hundred acres Beginning at a corner of Henry ffrey's Land Thence South East by Joseph Pyke's land One hundred and fifty perches to a post. Then obl North West by Henry ffrey's land one hundred obl fifty obl to a post. Again by the said ffrey's land South West One hundred^{obl} and Seven pches to the place of Beginning
