


Pennsylvania S.S.

By the Commissioners of Property



At the Request of Samuel Powel of the City of Philadelphia  
That we would Grant him to take up the quantity of three hundred Eighty  
Six Acres of Land the remainder of Seven hundred & fifty Acres the  
Original purchases made of the late Prop<sup>r</sup> William Penn Esq<sup>r</sup> Since  
Decd by John Longhurst & John Burchall both of the County of Sussex  
in Great Britain by Deeds of Lease & Releases dated ye 23<sup>d</sup> & 24<sup>th</sup> days  
of May and the 15<sup>th</sup> & 16<sup>th</sup> days of the same Month 1682. And also that we  
would Grant him to take up the further Quantity of One hundred and  
Sixty Acres the remainder of the Original purchase of two thousand  
five hundred Acres made of the said Propriet<sup>r</sup> by John Barber of the  
of the said County of Sussex by like Deeds of Lease & Release dated  
the 12<sup>th</sup> & 13<sup>th</sup> days of July Anno 1681 The Right to which several  
remainders which together make five hundred forty six Acres being by  
Sundry Mesne Conveyances now vested in the Said Samuel Powel These  
are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto  
the Said Samuel Powel according to the Method of Townships appointed  
the said Number of five hundred forty six Acres of Land that has not  
been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and  
make Returns thereof into the Secretary's Office Given under our hands  
and the lesser Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 25<sup>th</sup> day of the  
first month Anno Domini 1727
