

Pursuant to a warrant under the hand and Seal of the Prop^r Governour bearing date the 2^d day of the fourth Month 1701. Granting unto Randal Blackshaw (at the Request of Joseph Kirkbride) A Survey on five hundred acres of land part of 1500 acres bought by the Said Randal of James Harrison purchaser of 5000 acres. There is Surveyd and laid out unto the Said Randal Blackshaw a tract of land in Soulberry Township in the County of Bucks Beginning at a post at the Corner of Thomas Caruss land from thence by the Said land North east three hundred and twenty perches to a Second Post by a Great Maple tree by a run from thence by Vacant land Nor West two hundred and fifty perches to a third post and a heape of Stones from thence by Vacant land South West three hundred and twenty perches to fourth post ~~two~~ Chains North West from the Bank of a Run, from thence by land for a Road South east two hundred and fifty perches to the place of Beginning Containing five hundred acres. Surveyd by John Cutler the 30th day of the 3rd month 1702, Revised in the General Surveyors Office.
