 S^d Number of two hundred and fifty Acres of Land not
 already Survey'd nor taken up nor Concealed nor Seated by
 the Indians, and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries
 Office, Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at
 Philad'l'a the 7th day of the 11th Mo^t 1701.
