

Pursuant to two Warrants the one under the Hand and Seal of the Proprietary and Governor bearing date the 20<sup>th</sup> 8<sup>br</sup> 1701. Granting two hundred acres of land to be Survey'd and laid out unto Thomas Bye in Right and as part of three hundred acres granted by the Said Proprietarie to Samuel Martin of whom the Said Tho: Bye purchased the Same, The other warrant under the hands of the Commiss<sup>rs</sup> of property and the Seal of province bearing date the 7<sup>th</sup> of the 11<sup>th</sup> month 1701. Granting two hundred and fifty acres of land to be Survey'd and laid out to Edward Simphins originally purchased by him of the Proprietary The Said warrt granted at the Request of the above said Thomas Bye and Margaret his Wife Attorneys for the Said Edward Simphins.

There is Survey'd and laid out unto the Said Thomas Bye a Tract of land in Soulberry Township in the County of Bucks beginning at a heap of Stones by a Small White oak and extending by John Scarborrows land North east three hundred twenty four perches to a post by a Small white Oak from thence South east by Great Spring and by Vacant land two hundred and nineteen perches to a Corner marked black oak sapling, then by the Manner of Highlands South West three hundred twenty four perches to a great White <sup>OAK</sup> then by Vacant land North West two hundred and nineteen perches to the place of the Beginning Containing four hundred fourty three acres.
