

Pursuant to a warrant under the hands of the Commissioners of Property and the Seal of the province bearing date the 11<sup>th</sup> of the Sixth month 1702 Requiring a Resurvey on five hundred and eighty acres of land in the County of Bucks above the Manner of Highlands laid out unto William Beaks in <sup>Right</sup> of his original purchase of 1300 acres from the Proprietary ~~which~~ Land was Granted by <sup>to</sup> Said William or did some Way descend to his Son ~~Stephen~~ Stephen Beaks

There is Resurvey'd unto Stephen Beaks a parcel of land at Quattyclassie in Southampton Township in the County of Bucks beginning at a post by a black oak in Edward Hartley's line from thence by the Said Hartley's land and by Paul Woolf's land North West two hundred thirty four perches to a second post standing by a white oak from thence North east by Samuel Beaks's land and by Vacant land

four hundred twenty seven perches to a corner marked white oak from thence by William Crossdales land and by Randal Sp— ob— east two hundred thirty and four perches to post by three poplar trees upon one Root from thence South West by Land four hundred twenty seven perches to the place of Beginning Containing Six hundred and twenty four acres and Seventy eight perches. Resurvey'd by John Cutler the 12<sup>th</sup> day of the eighth Month 1702.
