

By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Comm<sup>r</sup>s to me directed bearing date the 10<sup>th</sup> of the first month 1702 to execute all warr<sup>t</sup>s directed to Phineas Pemberton and not executed. And pursuant to a Warr<sup>t</sup> from Edw: Penington Survey<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>r</sup> to the Said Phineas Pemberton dated the 10<sup>th</sup> of the 10<sup>th</sup> month 1701 for 200 ac: in Right of Samuel Martin And pursuant to a Warr<sup>t</sup> from the sd Comm<sup>r</sup>s to the Said Phineas date the 7<sup>th</sup> of the 11<sup>th</sup> Month 1701 for 250 ac: in Right of Edward Simkins, Surveyed and Laid out unto Thomas Bye a Tract of Land in Soubury township in the County of Bucks, Beginning at a heap of Stones by a Small White oak marked for a Corner, Thence by John Scarborough's land N.E. 324 perches to a Post by a small white oak. Then S.E. by Great Spring & Vacant Land 219 per to a corner marked black Oak Saplin. Then by the Manor of Highlands S.W. 324 perches to a Great White Oak. Then by Vacant - N.W. 219 perches to the beginning, Containing 438 Acres. (12 acres being deducted for Liberty Lands) Surveyed the 10<sup>th</sup> day of the 8<sup>th</sup> month 1702.
