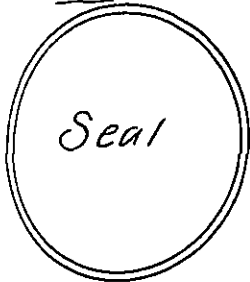


Pensylvania S.S.

By the Commission<sup>rs</sup> of Property

Whereas the Proprietor by good & Sufficient Deeds in ye Year 1681 Granted unto Dan' Wharley & Mary his Wife among others of the family of Isaac Penington Twelve hundred and fifty Acres of Land to be taken up in this Province in right of w<sup>ch</sup> there was a certain Tract Sett a part in the County of Bucks in the name of the S<sup>d</sup> Dan' Wharley & his brother Jn<sup>o</sup> Penington In w<sup>ch</sup> Tract by a prior Survey as it appears there was before laid out a certain parcel of Land containing about \_\_\_\_\_ Acres, being the Remaind<sup>r</sup> of Dave Wiggans & Samway their Original Purchase of 1500 Acres.

Now these are at the Request of Edw<sup>d</sup> Beeson Assignee of the S<sup>d</sup> Dan' Wharley to Authorize thee to Survey and lay out one Moiety of the S<sup>d</sup> Land after ye S<sup>d</sup> Purchase of Dave Wiggans & Samway is Completed to ye S<sup>d</sup> Edw<sup>d</sup> Beeson And further to lay out the full Complem<sup>t</sup> of the S<sup>d</sup> Daniels whole Purchase (the S<sup>d</sup> Tract & Liberty Land deducted) in Such other Vacant Land in thy Province according to the Method of Townships appointed as has not been Survey'd nor taken up, And make Returns there of into the Secretaries Office.
