

Pursuant to a warrant under the hand & Seal of Edward Pennington Surveyor General to Phineas Pemberton directed bearing date the 31<sup>st</sup> of the 10<sup>mo</sup> 1700 by vertue of a warrant under the hand & Seal of the proprietarie and Gover' to the said Edward Pennington dated the 12<sup>th</sup> of the eighth month 1700, Authorizing him to Survey and lay out unto Sedidiah Allen 230 acres of Land in Right of Nicholas Waln first purchaser of 1000 acres.

I do hereby Certifie That by vertue of a warrant under hands of the Commissioners of property and the Seal of the Proprietarie to John Cutler directed dated the 10 of the first month 1701 authorizing him to execute warrants directed to the Said Pemberton  
 The Jn<sup>o</sup><sup>sd</sup> Cutler hath made Returns <sup>into ye Gen'Surv's office</sup> of the Survey of the Said tract of 230 acres Survey'd to the Said Sedidiah Allen the 29<sup>th</sup> of the 3<sup>d</sup> month 1702 Which being Examined and Revised in the Said Office is as followeth Viz —

The said land Situate in Souberry township in the County of Bucks beginning at a post at the Corner of Paul Wolff's Corner by the Side of a Road, from thence extending by the said Wolff's land North east 320 perches to a post, from thence Northwest by Vacant land 115 perches to a post by a Spanish Oak, thence by Thomas Carus's land South West 320 perches to a post by a black oak Marked IA. then by the afore sd Road South East 115 perches to the place of Beginning, Containing ~~two~~ two hundred and thirty acres as aforesaid.
