By Vertue of a warrant from Capt William Markham Depty Govern^r and Com^{rs} Bearing date ye 10th of ye 9th month 1682: directed to me, I hereby Certifie into ye Proprietarys and Govern^{rs} Secretarys Office y^t I have Caused to be Surveyed and Laid out ye 17th day of ye Said month unto James Delworth purch^r A Certaine peece or p^{ob}l of Land Situate Lying and being in ye County of Buck on ye Eastermost Side of ye Neshamineh Creek Begining at a Corn^r marked post Standing by ye Said Creek, from thence East South East One hundred Eighty and Six perches to a Corn^r post thence East ten deg^{rs} Northerly by a Line of marked trees 760 perches from thence North ten - deg^{rs} Westerly by a Line of marked trees One hundred perches from thence West ten deg^{rs} North^{ly} by ye Land belong^{obl} to Thomas Stackhouse Sen^r 560 perches from thence West and by North^{ly} by ye Said Land fifty and two perches to a Corn^r marked tree Standing by ye afore mentioned Neshamineh Creek thence down the Severall Courses of the Said Creek to ye first Mencioned place of begining Containing and Laid out as above for five hundred acres and is accordingly Entred and Recorded in my office Philadelphia this 12th of ye third Moneth 1685
