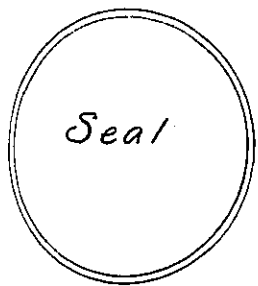

Whereas by my Letter to Phineas Pemberton Some time last Summer,
I ordered him to lay out one hundred Acres of Land in or near
Wrightstown In the County of Bucks to W^m Derrick^{ch} has not
yet been done, These are to require thee forthwith to ord^r the
S^d Phineas to Survey unto the S^d W^m Derrick the Said hundred
Acres of Land, in the place aforesaid And make Returns there-
of into my Secretaries Office, Which Survey being duly made
and returned, Shall if Seated within Six Months after tis laid out-
Shall be confirmed to him and his Heirs by Patent. He also complying
with his Agree^{mt} for ye Same. Given under my Hand and Seal at
Philad^{ia} the first day of ye first Moth 1709
