



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Com^{rs} to me directed bearing date the 24th / ~~1704~~ ¹⁷⁰⁴ to Resurvey a certain Tract of Land on Neshamenah Creek in Bucks^{County} now in the possession of Ralph Draycott and to make up the deficiency (if any be) out of the Neighbouring Tract, Resurveyed the Sd Tract (with 22 acres taken out of Evan Griffith's Tract by consent of both parties) Containing in all 250 acres Beginning at a Birch tree by the Sd Neshamenah — Thence by the Sd Evan Griffith's land W. 21^d N. 200 perches to a Post, Then by Thomas Stackhouse, & the Sd Evan Griffith W. 10^d N. 308. per: to a White Oak, Then by John Swift's land N. by W. 75. per: to a black Oak Then by land laid out to Israel Taylor E. by S. 553. perches to a Birch tree by the Sd Neshamenah — Then down the Several Courses thereof to the place of Beginning. Resurveyed the 6th day of the 3^d month 1704
