Thence by the said Kirles line ^{n.n.w} 637 perches to a Small Hickory in Joseph Growdon's line, Then by the Same E.N.E. 52 per to a Corner marked White Oak, Then by Tobias Dymock, Dunks and Claypole's line S.S.E. 659 Perches to a black Oak saplin by the Said River, Then down the Same W. by S 55 $\frac{1}{2}$ per to the place of beginning.
