The said Phineas Pemberton hath made Returns into the Generall Surveyors office of the Resurvey of a piece of Land Resurvey'd to W<sup>m</sup> Derrick the 14<sup>th</sup> of the 11<sup>mo</sup> 170<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> Which being Examined and Revised in the Said Office is as followeth Viz<sup>t</sup>

The Said Land Scituate in Wrightstown in the County of Bucks Beginning at a White Oak in Samuel Bakers Line at William Parlets Corner thence Extending by the Said Parlets line North West 192 perches to a Hickory tree thence South West 124 perches to a black Oak then by Vacant Land South east 192 perches to a post - Thence North east by the S<sup>d</sup> Samuel Bakers line 124 perches to the place of beginning Containing One hundred forty eight acres and one hundred twenty eight perches.
