At the Request of Michael Atkinson of _____ that We ^{would} Grant him to take up two Hundred Acres of Land in that Tract Called the Great Swamp in Bucks County for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors Use Six and Twenty pounds thirteen Shillings & four pence for the Whole of the Usual yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred Acres. These are to Authorize & Require thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyed unto the Said Michael Atkinson in the place aforesaid according to the Method of Townships Appointed the Said quantity of two hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make a Return thereof into the Secretary's office which Survey in case the Said Michael fulfill the above agreement at the Location Shall be Valid Otherwise the Same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted.
