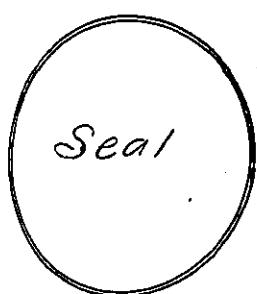


Pennsylvania SS



By the Commissioners of Property

Whereas by our Warr^t bearing date the 4th day of the Second Month 1706, We granted to Sam^l Cart to take up Six hundred and Sixty Nine Aores remaining unsurvey'd of one thousand acres Originally purchased by Edw^d. Martindale of Bristol and by him convey'd to Joshua Cart the Said Samuel's father, Since the date of w^{ch} Warr^t there is discovered a Certain Tract of four hundred Acres lying between the Lands of Benjamin East and James Claypoole near Meshamineh Creek in the County of Bucks appropriated to the S^d Purchase and now of right belonging to the S^d Samuel, These therefore are to require thee to resurvey or cause to be resurvey'd the S^d Tract of Land according to the true Bounds thereof and return the Same in the right afores^d into the Secretaries Office, Also to cause the remaining 269 Acres of the S^d purchase to be laid out & returned according to the Tenour of our afores^d Warr^t, Given under our hands & Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 23^d day of Septemb^r 1707
