



By virtue of a Warrant from the Comm^ts to me directed bearing date the 10th day of the first month 170 $\frac{1}{2}$ to execute all Warrts directed to Phineas Pemberton and not executed And pursuant to a Warrt from Edward Pennington to the Said Phineas Pemberton bearing date the first day of the 12th Month 170 $\frac{1}{2}$ Surveyed and Laid out unto Samuel Beaks in Right of Bartholomew and Joseph Thatchar a Tract of Land in Soulbury Township in the County of Bucks, Beginning at a Post by a black oak at Stephen Beaks's Corner, Thence N.W. by Paul Woolf and Thomas Garus land 17.5 per to a Post, Then by Ezra Croasdale's land N.E. 320 perches to a Post neare a forked black oak, Then S.E. by vacant land 17.5 per to a black oak Saplin in the Said Stephen Beaks's line, Then by the same S.W. 320 p. to the place of beginning, Containing 350 Acres. Surveyed the 15th day of the 8th Month 1702.
