



By virtue of a Warrant from Jacob Taylor Survey^r Gen^l to me directed bearing date the 22^d of the first month 170⁸ Pursuant to a Warr^t from the Commission^{rs} to the S^d Jacob Taylor bearing date the 21st of the first month 170⁸ to divide a certaine tract of Land in the County of Bucks Laid out to John Penington & Daniel Wharley between John Clark (Assignee of the S^d John Penington) And the Assigns of the S^d Daniel Wharley after a prior Survey to Dove Wiggins & Samway was taken out: & to lay out to the S^d John Clark the Remainder of the S^d John Peningtons Purchase of 1250 Acres; Surveyed & laid out unto the S^d John Clark in right of the S^d Purchase a Tract of Land neare Wrightstown in the S^d County Beginning at a White Oak at Wrightstown Corner, ffrom thence North East by Edward West's Land two hundred perches to a Post at William Smith's Corner, Then by the S^d Smith's Line South East two hundred & forty perches to a Small White Oak, Then by another Line of the S^d Smith's Land North East one hundred thirty four perches to a Post, Then by the Mannor of Highlands South East two hundred thirty six perches to a Spanish Oak on the Side of a Stony hill, Then South West by vacant Land three hundred thirty four perches to a Small Hickory in Wrightstown bounds, Then by the S^d bounds North West four hundred seventy six perches to the place of beginning, Containing Seven hundred Ninety two acres & an half; Together with 432 1/2 acres in the afores^d Tract, And 25 acres Liberty Lands makes up the S^d Purchase of 1250 Acres, Laid out the 11th day of the 6th month 1709.
