



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Comm<sup>rs</sup> bearing date the 11<sup>th</sup> of the 4<sup>th</sup> month 1712 to Survey unto John Decow in the right of Isaac Decow his ffather one thousand acres in the County of Bucks Surveyed & laid out unto the S<sup>d</sup> John Decow a tract of Land in the S<sup>d</sup> County, Beginning at a small black oak at a Corner of the London Company's Land, ffrom thence runing West by the S<sup>d</sup> Land one hundred Eighty Seven perches to a Hickory tree, Then North by Vacant Land one hundred & forty perches to a heap of stones, Then East Sixty perches to a Post, Then South Eighty perches to a black oak, Then East one hundred & twenty seven perches to a large black oak, (all these by Vacant Land) The by the S<sup>d</sup> London Company's Land South Sixty perches to the place of beginning, Containing one hundred acres, <sup>being the Resurvey of the S<sup>d</sup> 1000 acres</sup> Surveyed & Laid out the fifteenth day of the Sixth month 1715, Certified under my hand.
