 find convenient. These are to will & require thee forthw<sup>th</sup> to Survey or  
 cause to be Survey'd unto him ye Said Number of Acres where he  
 shall desire, provided it be not taken up already & according  
 to ye Method of Townships by me appointed, & make returns  
 thereof into my Secretary's Office - Given at Philadelphia the  
 10<sup>th</sup> of ye 12<sup>th</sup> Mo 1682.
