 rant from the Governour dated the 24<sup>th</sup> day of the 8<sup>th</sup> month 1701  
 unto Joseph Kirkbride 575 Acres in the ffalls townshipp in the County of  
 Bucks, Beginning at a Corner marked White oak being Richard Lundy's  
 Corner, Thence North 18 deg, west 3 1/2 perches, To A Post, Then N 56  
 deg<sup>s</sup> E 22 perches to a Corner marked Gum tree, Then N 8 deg: W 126 1/2  
 perches by Hills land to a Corner marked Poplar, Then west 6 deg<sup>e</sup>  
 N 31 perches to a Spanish oak, Then West 4 deg: S 214 perches to a  
 black oak by Smiths Land, Then W 2 deg: S 53 perches to a Corner  
 marked Hickery, Then S 2 1/2 gr<sup>s</sup>: W by Mananges and Thomas Atkinsons  
 Land 322 perches to a Corner marked black oak, Then East 72 perches  
 to a White oak, Then E 10 deg S 16 perches to a White oak, Then E 7  
 deg: S 83 perches to a Corner marked black oak at William Byles  
 Corner, Then by Byles Land N 34 deg: E 156 perches to a Chestnut tree  
 Then N.E by E 87 perches to the place of beginning, given under my hand
