him Liberty to Take up two hundred and fifty Acres of Land

being head Land for himself & Wife Son and Two Servants  
These are to will and require thee forthwith to Survey or Cause  
to be Surveyed unto him the Said Quantity of Land in a place  
not already taken up always provided that the head Land be  
behind the Purchasers according to the Regulation of  
Townships appointed by me and make returne therof unto my  
Secretarys Office.

Given at Sepassee ye <sup>Day</sup> 12 of the WTM Penn

Second M<sup>o</sup> 1683

To Tho. Holmes Surr<sup>t</sup> Generall

read ye 9<sup>th</sup> 11<sup>m</sup> & then orderd J.T. to Set it out accordingly  
after former War<sup>t</sup>
