Joseph Kirkbride of the County of Bucks, having purchased five hundred acres ~~of Land to be located~~ in this Province of Jeremiah ffowler and William Thorn Executors of William ffowler who bought the same of William Lawrence of Flushing in the Province of New York it being Part of Thomas Hudson's Purchase of the Proprietor and Joseph Kirkbride having sold four hundred acres thereof to Joseph Worth of Stony brook in West Jersey This may Certifie that There was Survey'd and laid out to the Said Joseph Worth the Said Number of acres in the Said County of Buck in Several Tracts ~~in~~ the first Lying in the Township of Buckingham - Beginning at a Large Black Oak at a Corner of Robert Smith Land Thence North West 212 perches to a black Oak in the Bounds of a Tract of Land formerly Layd out to Edward West Then North East by a Line of trees One hundred and Sixty poches to a White Oak Then by a Line of Trees ~~North~~^{South} East two hundred and twelve to a White Oak Then by the Land of the Said Robert Smith South West One hundred and Sixty perches to the place of Begin Containing two hundred and twelve acres

The other Tract Lying on the South side of Neshaminy Creek Beginning at a Corner of Samuel Bowers Land and Running by the same South West by West four hundred perches to a White Oak - Then North ten degrees by two hundred twenty four perches to a post Then East two hundred twenty two perches by Nicholas Land to a black Oak Stump Then North by West Sixty Eight perches to a black Oak by Neshaminy Creek Then down the several Courses of the same to the Place of Begin^g Containing two hundred and nine acres.
