This may Certifie that by Virtue of the above Warrant the above mentioned Tract of Land was Resurveyed and a Return of the Same made into the Surveyor Generals Office the said Tract of Land lying in the County of Bucks (within a mile of Philadelphia County) Beginning at a white Oake in a Line of Warmister Township and at a Corner of William ffishbourns Land, Thence Extending North West by the said ffishbourns Line ffour hundred & ten perches to a Spanish Oak Marked S.C. Thence North East ffour hundred & twelve perches to a Small black Oak, Then by the Land late of Nathan Stanbure^l and other Land South East ffour hundred and ten perches to a post by a Great White Oak, Then by Warmister Line South West ffour hundred and twelve perches to the place of Beginning, Containing One Thousand and fifty five acres & three quarters of an acre
