

I do hereby Certify that John Cutler hath made Returns into the General Surveyor's office of the Resurvey of a piece of land Resurvey'd to Samuel Allen the 19th day of the 1st Month 1701 by virtue of a Warrant under the hands of the Commissioners of property bearing date the 21st of the 11th month 1701 Which Said Return being examined and Revised in the said Office, is as followeth, Viz The said Land Situate in Bensalem Township in the County of Bucks, beginning at a Maple tree at Thomas Fairmans Corner by Neshamennah Creek from thence extending North West by West by the said Fairman's Land One hundred Sixty five perches to a Spanish Oak, thence North 9 degrees easterly two hundred and Seventy perches to a fallen White Oak, thence east north east by Joseph Growdons great Tract One hundred and eight perches to a White Oak thence South by Jonas Sheen's Land three hundred and five perches to a White Oak thence South east 46 perches to a black Oak by the said Neshamennah Creek Thence down the Said Creek Seventy four perches to the place of beginning Containing two hundred and Sixty acres.
